FRIDAY, June 5th

11am-5pm: Registration & Safety Tech/Lake Host Inspection

12pm-4pm: Continuous Practice* in order

SATURDAY, June 6th

7am-8:30am: Safety Tech/Host Inspection available for late arrivals. Every boat must be inspected before it hits the water!

7am-8:30am: Registration. *Practice order will be posted on the board and on socials.*

8:30am: Mandatory Riders Meeting. The first practice group should be ready to go at the Rider's Meeting!

9:00am: First practice immediately following Riders Meeting.

Approx. 10am (Immediately after practice): National Anthem. Racing begins - 1st Motos.

12:30-1pm: Half hour LUNCH break for ECW Staff. Racing resumes - 2nd Motos.

SUNDAY, June 7th

7am-8:30am: Safety Tech/Inspection.

7am-8:30am: Registration.

8:30am: Mandatory riders meeting.

9:00am: Last chance practice and new arrival practice only.

Approx. 9:30am: National Anthem & Racing begins after last chance practice. 3rd Motos.

12-12:30pm: Half hour LUNCH break for ECW Staff. Racing resumes - 4th Motos.

Approx. 4pm (half hour after the last class of the day): ROUND 1 AWARDS!

**We try our very best to adhere to our posted schedule. Race days can be unpredictable and any unforeseen changes will be posted (online/pit boards) as we try to inform racers of changes as soon as possible!

*Friday Practice is elective for those that would like extra time on the water. The cost is \$40 and is run in continuous group order from 12-4pm. **You must be an IJSBA member to race or practice.**

REGISTRATION INFO:

There are 3 steps to complete this process, if you do not complete these steps by the Wednesday before the race, you will be considered a late registration:

1. CREATE PROFILE >> 2. SELECT EVENT >> 3. REGISTER TO RACE YOUR CLASSES.

There is a \$25 late fee for registrations after Wednesday 6/3.

Payment is on-site only at check-in.

Each class competes in a total of 4 motos for the weekend: 2 on Saturday and 2 on Sunday, with points totaled for all 4 motos. Classes with 2 or more competitors will have awards presented to the top 3 finishers during Sunday evening's awards ceremony.

1st Class is \$240

2nd Class is \$200

3rd Class is Free. (Those choosing a 3rd class cannot be guaranteed a break between motos.)

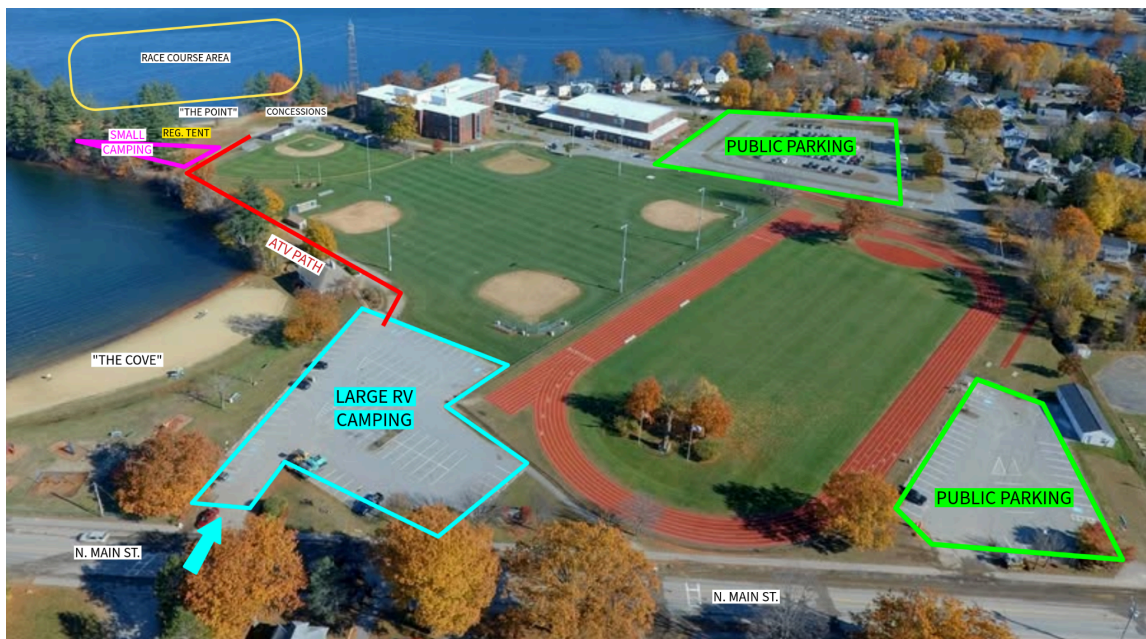

GPS Transponders:

New this year: At check-in, racers will be given a transponder for lap times and live scoring. Every racer must rent a transponder (\$40) for their boat for the weekend, family members can share transponders if they are in separate classes. Transponders need to be returned to Tech after Moto 2 Saturday (for overnight battery charging), will be given back after Mandatory Riders Meeting Sunday, and then must be returned to us again after Moto 4 Sunday. Tech can help you mount your transponder, if you do not already have a mounting bracket/clip, they are available on-site for \$10. A security deposit of \$250 will be held on your card, if the transponder is not returned at the end of the weekend, the \$250 will be captured.



Camping & Lodging:

Dry RV and Camping will be available at Opechee Park Friday AM to Sunday PM, these are the days approved to us, no early arrivals. Camping is \$100 for the weekend, first come first serve. We will have a parking attendant on Friday to help keep spots organized. Overflow parking will be available if needed. Enter from N Main St. into Opechee Cove parking lot. Racing will be at Opechee Point.

Large RVs park in the Cove Parking lot. Small camper/tent camping at the Point.

SURECAN FUELING STATION

Important: All racers must fuel their watercraft at the approved SureCan Fueling Station tent. There are no exceptions. Fueling your watercraft or ATV on the beach is prohibited. Thank you for understanding as we all do our absolute best to keep Opechee clean!

Opechee Bay Reservoir & Laconia, New Hampshire: Lake Opechee (O-Pee-Chee) also known as Opechee Bay Reservoir is a peaceful 426-acre lake nestled between Lake Winnepesaukee and Lake Winnisquam, just minutes from downtown Laconia.

- Sights & Sounds: "The Defiant One" A 40-ft Native American carving by Peter Wolfe, a striking 40-foot-tall sculpture by artist Peter Wolfe. Carved from a single white pine in 1987, the sculpture depicts a Native American figure with arms outstretched, symbolizing strength and resilience. Due to weather and insect damage, the sculpture was 3D scanned, recreated, and installed in 2024.
- Live Music Downtown: There is a live band scheduled for Canal Street, downtown Laconia (2 minutes from Opechee Park) on June 5th, 5-9pm.
- The World's Largest Arcade: Funspot. Over 600 arcade games, including pinball classics and modern tech, plus a restaurant, tavern and bowling alley.
- Weirs Beach: Scenic Lake Winnepesaukee (NH's largest lake), M/S Mount Washington cruise ship, boardwalk and arcade, Weirs Beach Drive-In and home of Laconia Motorcycle Week, the oldest national Motorcycle Rally in the US. *Our race is scheduled one week before the 103rd Laconia Bike Week!*

East Coast Watercross Aquatic Invasive Species Protocol

Aquatic invasive species (AIS) are plants and animals that are non-native to bodies of water and can pose problems that can be difficult to eliminate. All ECW racers must adhere to the AIS policy and protocol stated below. Safety Tech/Host inspection Staff will be monitoring these steps as well. Boats must be clean and approved by Tech Inspection before entering the water at any race. GETTY SHINE is available on-site to help with high-temperature washing.

1. CLEAN

CLEAN off all plants, animals, and debris from boats, trailers, and any gear that has come into contact with the water. To clean your watercraft or recreational gear, use 120°F high-pressure water, or if not available, water from the hose. Make sure runoff water does not flow into the lake.

2. INSPECT

INSPECT your boat and gear for any visible plants and animals, placing species in a trash can or area where they do not pose a risk of re-entry into the water. All boats must be cleaned and free of invasive debris, or will be subject to a failed inspection. Racers then need to clean and inspect their boat before being rechecked by Tech.

3. DRAIN & DRY

DRAIN all water and open drain plugs. When draining your watercraft, raise and lower the motor to remove all water, open drain plugs, and empty live wells. Drain water where it does not pose a risk of entry into the waterbody. If possible, leave your watercraft and gear in the sun to dry for five days, keeping compartments open to air out. **Always clean & inspect your boat, trailers and belongings after a race.**
